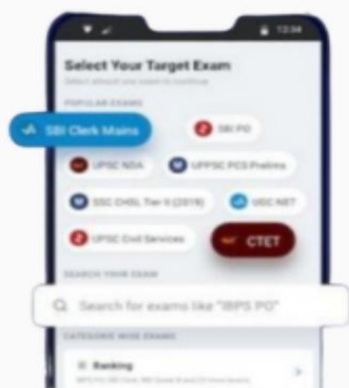
Most modules require 60% marks. Some allow negative marking.
